ROTARY CLUB OF LUSAKA CENTRAL PROJECTS SUCCESSFULLY UNDERTAKEN/PLANNED

1. **IMPACT ONE PHASE II US \$ 44,177 APPROVED IN 2024**

Following the successful completion of Impact one Initiative with the Rotary Club of Paducah. Rotary Club of Lusaka Central applied for the second Global Grant project to provide support to the community schools in Ngómbe compound of Lusaka. The Rotary International has approved the submission for the amount of US 44177 recently. This is to facilitate 12 laptops for the school administration and 84 tablets for teaching and learning. This also includes technical support, training of trainers, development of Professional development action plan and monitoring the implementation plan.

2. **IMPACT ONE PHASE I US \$ 46,400 WAS EMBARKED ON 2018**

Impact One Initiative in partnership with the Rotary Club of Paducah in Kentucky USA was to support community schools in Ngómbe compound of Lusaka with educational technologies that would assist to address the issue of teaching qualities in various subject areas, with a strong focus on literacy using educational software. The use of Tablets and computers to teachers and students would enhance their teaching and learning skills. In the first stage 10 community schools in Ngómbe were identified and tablets and computers were handed over. The programme was closely monitored by Impact One and Rotary Club of Lusaka Central.

Considering the favourable outcome of the pilot project the Rotary Club of Lusaka Central in partnership with the Rotary Club of Paducah has initiated phase 2 with the expectations of even better results.

3. **10,000 HAPPY BIRTHDAYS: US\$108, 032**

Maternal mortality is a major public health concern. It is estimated that 830 women die from pregnancy or childbirth related complications around the world every day. Almost all of these deaths occurred in a low – resource areas and most could have been prevented.

In Zambia, the maternal mortality is estimated at 380 per 100,000 live births, the ratio is unacceptably high given that evidence – based high impact interventions exist, which can save mothers and neonates lives during childbirth.

In order to reduce the maternal mortality rate, in Zambia. The Rotary Club of Lusaka Central embarked on a project, the project was to train 1,500 midwives to be placed in five Districts of Zambia.

4. REDUCING THE INCIDENCE OF WATER RELATED INFECTIONS BY DRILLING 17 BOREHOLES IN MBAYAMUSUMA – US\$ 36,000

Mbayamusuma Rural Health Centre is located about 45Kms from Mazabuka town situated in Chivuna ward. Rotary Club of Lusaka Central undertook to drill 17 boreholes, equip them with hand pumps and associated civil works.

This project was successfully completed and handed over to the community. These boreholes serve a population of about 8,328 people scattered in its catchment areas, the aim of the project was to reduce water related diseases and also assist the community in farming.

5. “Water to Village” programme

This project was carried out in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Nordstrand of Norway and Rotary International (RI) and facilitated on a self-help basis. This involved digging approximately 140 wells, all wall-lined and equipped with an India Mark II Handpump and a Windlass in three provinces, namely Copperbelt, Central and Lusaka. In areas where water was not readily reached within 10 metres, boreholes were drilled which were roughly 10-12 in number. The total cost of the Project was **US\$750,000.00**

6. St John Paul Hospital Known as Italian Orthopaedic Hospital.

Construction and conversion of the existing building to a speciality Hospital and providing necessary equipment and other facilities were donated by the Rotary Club of Fermo Italy, Chirstofel blinden Mission Germany, Cheshire International, Hilde Caminer Trust, and Swiss Counterpart Fund and Rotary Club of Lusaka Central.

Apart from the major projects described above our Rotary Club of Lusaka Central have carried out numerous other projects such as:

1. Distribution of hygiene kits to girls in over 10 community schools in N'gombe compound and intends to extend distribution to community schools in Chainta
2. Rheumatic heart disease control programme – VITA NOVA
3. Programme for fight against alcohol and drug abuse
4. Visit to YWCA Children in Crisis in woodlands with some gifts and cakes
5. Donation of sewing machines to Little Assisi, School for Disabled in Ngombe and to YWCA for self – sustenance
6. Assisting a teacher to advance her education and skills for the benefit of larger sections of students.
7. It has been a practice for Rotary club of Lusaka Central during the Christmas period to donate some goodies to needy children in the Society and orphanages.

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The Rotary Club of Lusaka Central that I know

I was invited to become a member of the Rotary Club of Lusaka Central and proposed by Rtn. PP Arne and was inducted in 1977 as Member of Rotary Club of Lusaka Central. The two members who were there then and am glad to say, s ll with us are the Charter Member PP Rt. Kan and PP Rtn. Arne. The Club as I recall was very ac ve and I soon got involved with projects.

One of the major on-going project that was being implemented when I joined was the “Water to Village” programme carried out in conjunc on with the Rotary Club of Nordstrand of Norway and Rotary Interna onal (RI) and facilitated on a self-help basis. This involved digging approximately 140 wells, all wall-lined and equipped with an India Mark II Handpump and a Windlass in three provinces, Copperbelt, Central and Lusaka. In areas where water was not readily reached within 10 metres, boreholes were drilled which was roughly 1012 in number. The total cost of the Project was US\$750,000.00. The Project was successful due to par cipa on by the communi es as they did the digging of the individual wells. The project was regularly monitored by the members of the Nordstrand Rotary Club. A detailed report was compiled and published and according to me as a qualified field scien fic officer it was one of the best programmes I have seen done. The Project was spearheaded by PP Rt. Arne who was fundamentally instrumental in its successful comple on.

An equally important and massive programme was that of the “Book Distribu on Project” spearheaded by CP PP Rtn. Kan carried out in conjunc on with suppliers of books from USA. Several container loads of books were received that otherwise would have ended up in a pulp factory in USA, over next three years and these were distributed to schools throughout Zambia. According to my evalua on as I along with my two sons and my Ann Lalitha were involved in stamping and packing for distribu on, the despatch of some 3000040,000 volumes over a three-year period; another major successful programme. Many school and educa onal centres benefited.

The Club undertook and carried out over a three-year programme a Project that can be described as “Solar Cooking”. This was introduced to the rural communi es around Lusaka and was done in conjunc on with the Rotary Club of Fremo in California, USA.

The aim was to prevent cu ng down of trees for charcoal and to educate in the use of solar power. An intense programme was done in and around Chongwe and it was indeed a moderate success. The key take aways were the importance of conserva on and of course the power of sunshine i.e. solar power that is now being accepted as the way forward and understood not only by rural Zambia

but also by the urban dwellers. The Chongwe work included in rehabilitating a school and construction of a medical clinic.

Under the “Skills Training Project” the Club undertook an intensive training scheme to enable school-leavers to become competent in tailoring, carpentry, welding and brick laying. This Project was a big success and a number of individuals were set up to become independent entrepreneurs. A number of so trained individuals are running tailoring shops in the Mumbwa area. This Project eventually led to construction of buildings in Kabulonga, close to the Dutch Reformed Church. The building complex is being earmarked to be a centre for such training programme. The issue of ownership of the land and indeed the buildings on it, as many members in the Club will know, is now under review.

A project designed to help people, mainly women to succeed in business was that of “The Micro-Finance Project”. Under this scheme overseen by PP Rtn. Nic, several women were given small amounts of cash as loans to set up whatever business they planned, generally retail sale goods bought wholesale. Over a two-year period, the programme was an immense success. Over 80% of the money lent was returned indeed and helped to continue the work for a few years, the funds eventually being donated to projects. This is possibly a project that deserves a revisit.

Project, “Trees and Greening the Planet” was yet another programme aimed at conservation and education. Under this programme fruit trees and other indigenous trees were obtained from nurseries and Forest Department and subsequently planted mainly in schools around Lusaka. In order to ensure that the seedlings survived, each plant had to be adopted by a child in the school. This was another successful programme and some 12,000 trees were planted. An inspection done some 6 years later showed that many of the trees in the schools have survived and yielding. Another Rotary Club of Lusaka Central contribution.

“Wheel Chair Distribution” was a Project that led to some three hundred wheelchairs being received in kit form, assembled by Rotarians and distributed to needy institutions and individuals throughout the country. It is important to note that many items including wheel chairs and hospital beds were sent to far off places such as Mongu, Rufunsa and Mansa. Thus, the Club played a crucial role in ensuring that disadvantaged people outside Lusaka were not forgotten.

A massive project that the Club has been involved in conjunction with Rotary Clubs in Italy was the “Italian Orthopaedic Hospital”. Work included securing the premises, converting the existing structure into a hospital, equipping and

indeed managing. The Project is on-going. All this was done with the support of many organisations and people and even as I write two of the Club members Rtn. PP Francis Ndilila and Rtn. PP Daljeet Singh sit on the Board to ensure satisfactory running of the hospital.

Lusaka Central was a pioneer Club in Zambia to admit women to membership and it's a pleasure to report we have had some very able and successful women Presidents: PP Rtn. Phidelia, PP Rtn. Jennifer, PP Rtn. Irene and now our current President Rtn. Monika.

The Club to support its varied programme has held regular Fund-Raising Projects and these have included, the Golf Tournaments, Charity Walks, Raffle Ticket Sales, Cinema Events and also Vehicle Park Facility. In addition, Individual contributions have also been significant and here special mention has to be made that of PP Rtn. Jamshid, Rtn. Roberto Dona ni, PP Rtn. Daljeet Singh and PP Rtn. Tejindra Singh.

We Serve and have successfully provided Service above Self. This brief on the Club is to provide a nutshell story of significant happenings over the past 47 years. In all the Club has done programmes and upheld the seven pillars of Rotary International.

Malaria is a serious and sometimes fatal disease caused by a parasite that commonly infects a certain type of mosquito which feeds on human blood.

It's caused by Plasmodium parasites, primarily *P. falciparum* and *P. vivax*, transmitted through the bite of infected *Anopheles* mosquitoes.

Common symptoms include fever, chills, headache, muscle aches, and fatigue. If not treated, it can lead to severe complications and death.

Prevalence: Malaria is most prevalent in tropical and subtropical regions, particularly in sub-Saharan Africa, South Asia, and parts of South America.

Prevention methods include using insecticide-treated bed nets, indoor residual spraying, antimalarial medications (chemoprophylaxis), and avoiding mosquito bites.

Despite significant progress, malaria continues to be a major global health challenge, causing hundreds of thousands of deaths annually, predominantly among young children

However, all-volunteer group of Rotarians and leaders of non-governmental organizations whose core objective is to inspire everyone and campaign for Malaria eradication and mobilize funding for global projects to alleviate the impact of malaria.

Therefore, RHCC is one of the Rotary Committee embarking malaria projects where I belong. The project provides Ministries of Health, Rotary members and Partners in targeting countries with longer-term resources to implement large-scale, high-impact programs to reduce severe disease and death from malaria, pneumonia, and diarrhea.

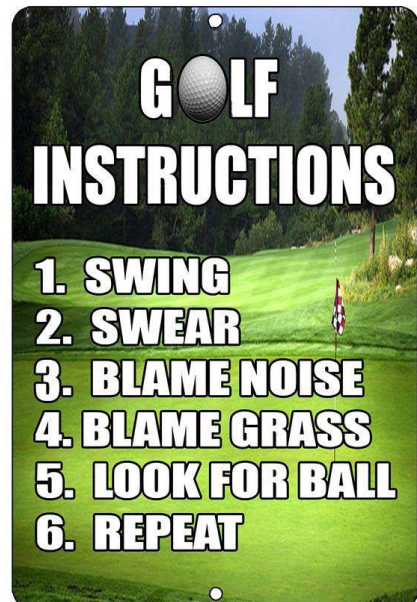
